Mary Shepherd Philosophy Conference School of Philosophy, Psychology and Language Sciences Tommy Zhang (Student)	The Mary Shepherd Philosophy Conference is a conference organised by undergraduate students and the aim of the conference is to bring together undergraduates, postgraduates, and faculty members to discuss issues that contribute to the systematic under-representation of certain groups within philosophy
It's Your Journey Go Abroad John Bennett (Staff)	Student surveys consistently highlight the need to provide a greater level of support to students who are going abroad. In order to respond to that need, we organised a series of workshops to help improve student support at all stages of an international learning experience: orientation, pre-departure, during mobility, and on return.
